Reading - Our focus for next week will be identifying different story elements such as sequence of events, cause \& effect, and comparing \& contrasting characters within the texts. We will be applying these skills to the various fictional stories in class in order to better comprehend the overall plot of what we read.

Spelling- Every night students have to complete spelling homework with their spelling words. At their own pace, students must complete enough activities to earn 10 points by Friday. Students need to try to refrain from using the same activity more than once a week. Each new activity needs to be labeled with their name, date, activity \#, and point value.

Writing - In Writing Workshop we are wrapping up or graphic organizers, rough drafts, and are moving on to the editing process. Students will be working individually, with peers, and with the teacher during this writing process.

Math - We are continuing to put a heavy focus on our multiplication facts over the next few weeks. Students are using flash cards, different iPod applications, and math games to help them memorize each fact in school. Yet, we will still need students to practice their multiplication facts at home as
well! Each week we will have quizzes on multiplication and have created a special chart to track our progress from the 0's to the 12 's. Students are also understanding the relationship between multiplication and division as we work in our math centers to apply these skills.

Next week we will also begin to review algebraic equations.

Science - Our science unit this quarter is studying elements of the Sun, Moon, and Stars! Students will need to continue to observe the moon this last week on their Moon Calendar. We will use the trend in their observations to come to a conclusion about the pattern of the phases of the moon. This counts as part of their homework, so please help remind students of their new assignment this month. If students are having issues seeing the moon because of weather, have them describe what the sky looked like instead. For example: "cloudy and the moon was not visible" or "starry night, but no moon," etc...
