



Reading – Our focus for next week will be identifying different genres of fiction, such as: fantasy, fairytales, fables, short stories, and novels. We will also be learning more about story elements like plot, conflict & resolution, main idea, sequence of events, main characters, and setting.

Spelling- Every night students have to complete spelling homework with their spelling words. **At their own pace, students must complete enough activities to earn 10 points by Friday.** Students need to try to refrain from using the same activity more than once a week. Each new activity needs to be labeled with their name, date, activity #, and point value.

Writing – In Writing Workshop we have started to develop ideas for our own personal narratives. The class has chosen to focus on “an exciting time” in their life that they would like to write about. We have picked our focus for the story, so students are now working on narrowing down a large idea into a specific moment to write about in their short story.

Flat Stanley is still on the move! We have started to receive Flat Stanley letters and photographs back from our friends and family. We will be hanging up 3 personal collages of Flat Stanley and his trips in front of our room next week. Hopefully more letters and pictures will arrive soon, which is so exciting!

Math – During this past week we have started to put a heavy focus on our multiplication facts. Students are using flash cards, different iPod applications, and math games to help them memorize each fact in school. Yet, we will still need

students to practice their multiplication facts at home as well! Each week we will have quizzes on multiplication and have created a special chart to track our progress from the 0's to the 12's.

In student Friday Folders, a letter went home describing the Multiplication Sundaes Strategy we are using in class. Attached to this newsletter is another copy of the process, so please familiarize yourself with it and let me know if you have any questions! Math is fun, but we are making it extra sweet! ☺

Science – Our science unit this quarter is studying elements of the Sun, Moon, and Stars! Students will need to observe the moon each night on their Moon Calendar that went home last week. This counts as part of their homework, so please help remind students of their new assignment this month. If students are having issues seeing the moon because of weather, have them describe what the sky looked like instead. For example: “cloudy and the moon was not visible” or “starry night, but no moon,” etc...

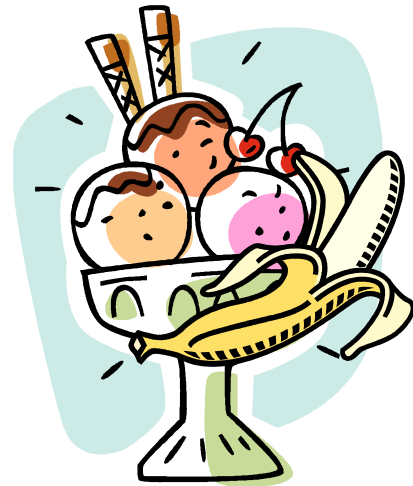




Multiplication Madness!

In order to help students master their multiplication facts from 0's to 12's, our class will be "building multiplication sundaes!" We will be learning strategies and memorizing techniques for our multiplication facts in class. When each set of facts are mastered by the student, they will move their name up a chart to show their progress. Each level of the chart is worth a different sundae item, which they will earn as they master their facts. At the end of our multiplication unit, the students will receive the sundae they earned based on their level on the chart. The progression is as follows from bottom up:

12's	Certificate of Completion
11's	Cherry on top
10's	Whipped cream
9's	Topping choice
8's	Topping choice
7's	Topping choice
6's	Banana
5's	Scoop of ice cream
4's	Scoop of ice cream
3's	Scoop of ice cream
2's	Spoon
1's	Bowl
0's	Invitation to sundae celebration



When our class is close to mastering all facts, I will send home more information and a sign-up sheet for parents to help provide sundae items and assist in the serving process! Thank you for all your support and help with this objective and let's have fun doing it!
