Reading - Our focus in reading this past week has been finding the main idea and supporting details in the texts we read. Next week we will review a variety of skills based on student assessments to provide remediation on the objectives students still need more practice with.

Spelling- At their own pace, students must complete enough activities to earn 10 points by Friday. Students need to try to refrain from using the same activity more than once a week. Each new activity needs to be labeled with their name, date, activity \#, and point value.

Writing - In Writing Workshop we have finished the publishing process of our personal narratives. Now students are practicing writing more stories independently and trying to utilize their editing skills learned in $3^{\text {rd }}$ quarter.

Math -This past week we have been working on elapsed time. This math objective is very difficult to master and many students still need a great deal more practice. Please review math work sent home that contains exercises about elapsed time. We will continue to revisit this objective throughout the school year. Next week we will learn about measurement of capacity (Gallons, quarters, pints, \& cups) as well as temperature in Fahrenheit and Celsius.

Social Studies - We only have about $11 / 2$ weeks left in our social studies unit: Change over Time. This unit is full of great history and activities that will display to students how people, the environment, and the way of life have changed over the years.

During this Change over Time unit, students have been "living life" through the eyes of Pioneers. To integrating different subjects this quarter, we have been writing from the point of view of a character from Little House on the Prairie. Not only are students learning about the past, but they are also getting a chance to "live it."

Therefore, in order to celebrate such a great learning experience, we will be having a Pioneer Day on Thursday, April $7^{\text {th }}$ !
